

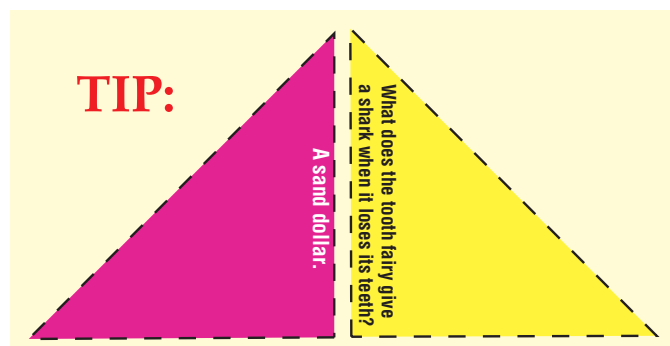
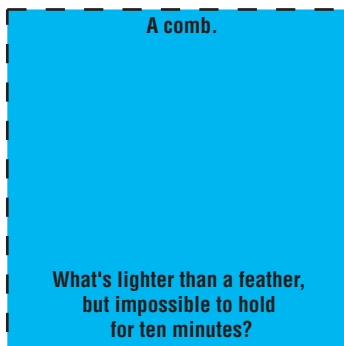
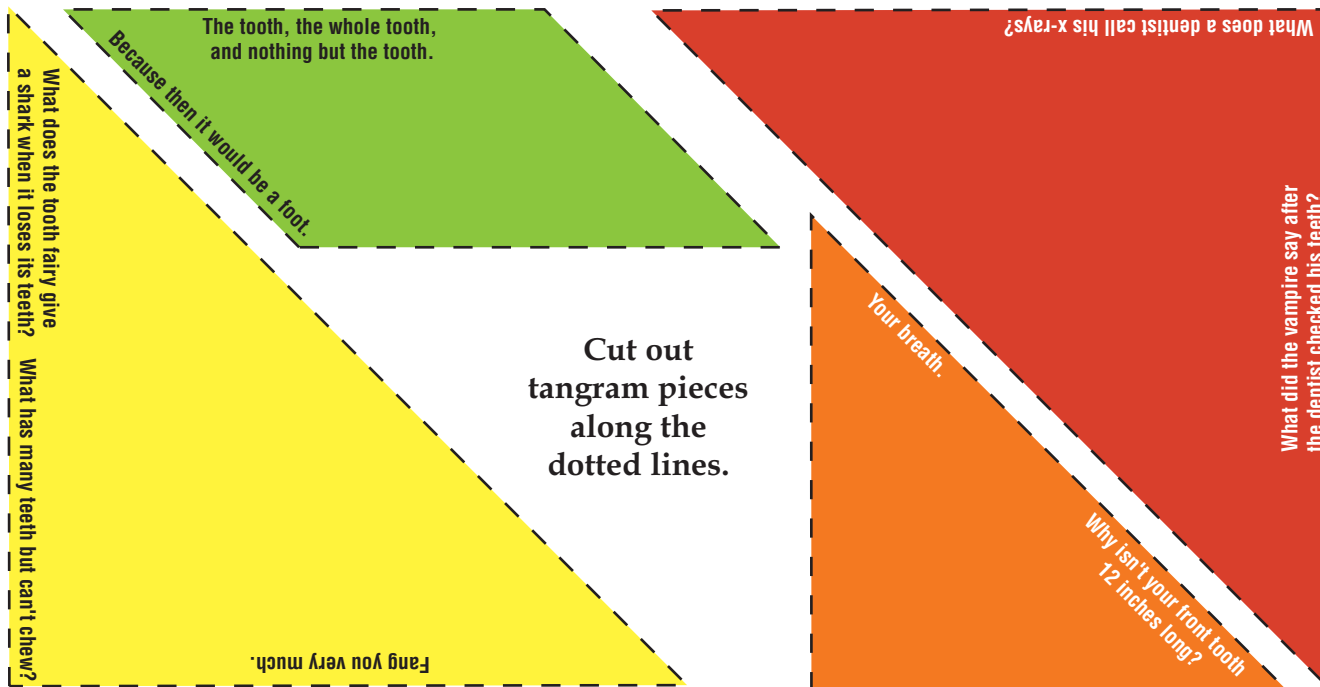


FUN with TANGRAMS
